Our main speaker for the evening will be Judge Fitch, Presiding Judge, Juvenile Court, County of Fresno. We want this to be an occasion for volunteers, financial contributors, board of directors, staff and others interested in VORP to get together for inspiration, encouragement, and celebration. If you have any questions please call. We encourage you to bring interested friends since this will be a good time to find out about VORP. Just let us know how many will be coming.

Lives are being affected by the VICTIM OFFENDER RECONCILIATION PROGRAM. Following is a recap of a recent experience as shared by Gail Boldt, our Mennonite Voluntary Service person. I recently had the pleasure of working with volunteer Jane Krantz on a case. It involved a teenage girl who burglarized the home of an older friend for whom she was babysitting. The victim turned out to be a very expressive and loving woman. She told very honestly of the extreme pain of having had her trust and her home violated, and of having sentimental objects stolen which she never recovered. At the same time, she had great compassion for the offender, going as far as inviting her back to the home and offering that she is still her friend. On the offender's side, we saw remorse over the act, but also great fear and pain in relationship to her parents, one of whom was present at the meeting. It was obvious that there was a real lack of trust and communication between the parents and the girl. Her pain was evidenced in that she could not quit crying during the hour meeting, and she became much more upset when talking about her relationship with her parents. The result of the expressed pain of both victim and offender was that they held each other's hand through much of the meeting, came up with a restitution contract, and were genuinely reconciled. Jane and I came away from that meeting with quite mixed emotions. We felt good knowing that we had faciliatated a good VORP meeting where a relationship was restored. We could not, however, address all of the pain which seemed to be in all areas of the offender's life. This served as a sad reminder that we all must be ministering to one another continuously, seeking to bring a more complete healing with God's help.

Our Board of Directors has decided that while state or local gevernment funding would be helpful and allow us to serve additional persons or additional needs, it is important that the basic support for our program come from individuals and churches in the community who know what VORP is about and want to participate in it. The VORP Board is inviting you to join in support of this unique ministry by becoming a "Friend of VORP". As a "Friend", you will commit yourself to making a monthly or yearly contribution so that VORP can continue and expand on a solid financial foundation.

The Board of Directors has decided that the amount needed to provide the basic financial foundation is \$2,500.00 per month. Since our rent is donated along with some other expense items, this will provide a part-time director, a full time Mennonite Voluntary Service person, a part-time secretary, and meet our volunteer training expenses, and other basic expenses and allow us to handle approximately 20 cases per month.
